ACE-U English consists of activities and demonstrations which will develop skills in literary appreciation, essay analysis and composition, creative writing and/or media study. Students are encouraged to choose a fiction or non-fiction focus depending on academic and career goals.

This course is also designed to enhance students' ability to synthesize researched information and critique a variety of writing modes. ACE-U English prepares students for college degree programs or other postsecondary programs that ask for Grade 12 University preparation equivalency as an English prerequisite.

Students must display strong skills in grammar and reading comprehension in order to be accepted into this course. The pre-requisite for ACE English is at the discretion of the program faculty, based on prior completion of LBS 4 & 5 English with a minimum percentage 85 A or direct entry based on functional level and prior learning assessment. Students wishing to earn ACE (Academic and Career Entrance) certification and/or enter community college degree programs must complete all the following modules.
